Expectations / Accountabilities		

The Live-In Recovery House Manager is responsible for overseeing all house responsibilities and program requirements. She will work in conjunction with the Hope Centre team and be supported by a House Leader (not live-in). Work responsibilities will be balanced with personal time. The House Manager is welcome to leave or stay during personal time. Life experience is more important than education or work experience in this position. She must be able to handle strong personalities and be comfortable in sensitive situations. Our women's home will offer a safe place for those experiencing addiction, mental health challenges, homelessness and sexual related trauma. The Live-In House Manager does not need to be an expert, but has the ability to support the recovery process and partnerships in those fields.

This role will come with a base salary, free rent, and all groceries will be provided.

The Learnington Community Hope Centre is a faith based non-profit organization. We host and facilitate multiple programs including a nightly drop-in, a church service, multiple recovery meetings, counselling, life skills classes, and currently two transitional recovery homes.
